and operated hospitality corporation headquartered in Stuart, it meant sticking to the plan, digging deep, putting the safety of guests and team associates first and pivoting constantly.



The Stuart Air Show's mission is to celebrate aviation by honoring its past and inspiring its future. And each year it provides memorable experiences and opportunities to area schools, students, families, and visitors to learn more about aviation, American history, and the U.S. Armed Forces.

The Stuart Air Show became a non-profit organization in 2009 to advance its work in the community while continuing to provide a safe, unique family entertainment experience. The show's charitable giving to area non-profits through event access, exclusive event partnerships and enhancements is meaningful and steadfast.

Recognized as one of the largest community events on Treasure Coast, the three-day experience features thrilling performances by nationally known performers as well as interesting and historical static displays of aircraft and vehicles.

And when tragedy hit the Stuart Air Show in 2019, followed by the global pandemic, the show's leadership team heard the call of duty. Against many odds, they organized and produced the 2020 show, one of only three airshows in the entire nation that year (when traditionally 350 airshows annually would fill the skies of North America). Commitment, perseverance, and community spirit embodies the Stuart Air Show, all while being a significant contributor to Martin County's local economy.



Brian O'Connor, President of Air Burners, has been in the business for several decades in Martin County. He is a recognized innovator and champion for one of the most effective solutions to optimize landfill diversion and continuously finds win-win ways to fight climate change that also make economic sense.

His high standard of design and manufacturing has made Air Burners the recognized leader in Air Curtain Burner equipment and technology. Air Burners systems are used worldwide in the construction industry to support land clearing operations, in the forests for wildfire mitigation efforts and at landfill sites to help increase landfill life. They are also used in disaster recovery for clearing the aftermath from storm or flood damage and play a key role in many contingency plans for disaster recovery throughout the world.

Currently, the Air Burners team is working with the U.S. Forest Service to develop a new machine that will produce Biochar, a natural soil amendment. The innovative product known as CharBoss is expected to be released in mid-2022.

Additionally, the team is designing a power producing machine called the PGFireBox to support the movement towards battery powered industrial vehicles, like excavators and loaders. This forward-looking initiative for battery powered machinery (called the "Electric Forest"), will once again help transform the industry by bringing low cost recycled products direct from forest to market.

Charlene Hoag resided in Martin County for 21 years, and had an extensive knowledge of Martin County, its diverse communities and an excellent understanding of the major economic issues that face Martin County.

Charlene was a former Martin County Commissioner (Chair in 1994), with a long history of community involvement. 
