It was noted that the BDB has received a letter from the County asking the organization to focus on key industries and strategic geographic areas which the proposed FY 2023 Business Plan & Budget addresses while also recognizing the importance of focusing activities to achieve desired outcomes.

During discussion, it was suggested that inviting key leaders from Tallahassee to attend major events might help state relations and updating the narrative that Martin County is open for business.

A motion was moved by Commissioner Troy McDonald to approve the FY 2023 Business Plan and Budget as presented. Seconded by Tommy Bueno. Approved 11-0.

- Other Director Items Announcements: Several Directors noted the community's growing sentiments around residential development projects and suggested the organization be prepared to address any questions that arise about how economic development affects fears of congestion, too many people and "anywhere USA." - 1. Call to Order and Welcome: Eric Kiehn, President Elect of the Board, called the meeting to order at 8:48 am. During Board roll call, it was determined an in-person quorum was not established.
- 2. Public Comments: None.
- 3. Partner Comments: None.
- **Welcome New BDB Investors**: Eric Kiehn, President Elect and Joan K. Goodrich welcomed representatives from Cleveland Clinic | Martin Health, First Citizen's Bank, Manpower, and Martin County REALTORS of the Treasure Coast as the BDB's newest economic champions and thanked them for their partnership and leadership supporting Martin County.
- 5. Approval of April 13, 2022, Minutes: No action taken.
- 6. Approval of March 2022 Financials: No action taken.
- 7. Approval of FY 2023 BDB Business Plan & Budget: No action taken, and the presentation made for informational purposes only. Joan K. Goodrich highlighted the four (4) proposed priority area designed to build upon the BDB's efforts in FY 2022 and accomplish the following:
  - a. Informs Martin County is Open for Business (Now's the Time)
  - b. Fosters Leading Industries and Good Jobs (Hubs of Excellence)
  - c. Grows Our Own (Propel (Entrepreneurship), Pulse (Business Retention Expansion), Talent)
  - d. Promotes Strategic Areas and Districts for Job Creators

The Business Plan's proposed key metrics for performance accountability were also reviewed and discussed in depth with the result of adding number of businesses assisted to the top-level metrics of economic development announcements, jobs created-retained, square footage impacted, direct business capital investment generated, and referrals produced.

Ms. Goodrich also indicated the proposed FY 2023 Business Plan and Budget funds the next phase of the Now's the Time marketing campaign; key sales activities from the Hubs of Excellence Business Development Strategy focusing on the Aviation-Aerospace and Marine hubs; launch of the Corporate Council to lead the



Pulse program featuring 50 visits-online surveys-year-end report; two Side Hustle to Main Gig cohorts; two Future of Work and Learning events; annual Martin County Business Awards and PR-Communications.

For staffing and leadership engagement in FY 2023, it was noted the budget funds the existing four full time positions, although as fundraising occurs and business development results and activities increase, staffing plan upgrades may be needed. The current BDB Leadership Engagement Model launched in FY 2022 will continue and with a fundraising goal of \$185,000.

#### 8. Board 2 x 2 x 2.5 Initiative:

- **a. Pulse Visits**: Jaymie Sardo, Economic Development Coordinator explained the 1:1 Pulse visits with our local business owners, accompanied with a board member, investor, partner and/or BDB staff member, are part of the BDB's business retention and expansion efforts to take their 'pulse', identify current issues, provide resources and how we can assist in their needs. 55 visits have been completed to date with a current goal of 75 for this fiscal year.
- **b. Testimonials**: Eric Kiehn presented new testimonials from Directors Patrick Gleason and Tommy Bueno explaining why Martin County a great place for business. Additionally, Ike Crumpler, PR and Communications liaison announced that he has drafted testimonials for the remaining members for consideration and revisions aiding in the board's goal efforts to achieve 100% participation.
- c. Fundraising: Tommy Bueno thanked Cleveland Clinic, Martin County REALATORS of the Treasure Coast, Manpower and First Citizens Bank for their recent investment and support. Mr. Bueno continued that we have achieved one third of our investment goal of \$157,000 and encouraged continued support from other local organizations, small businesses and board members as we move forward in partnership towards economic development in Martin County.
- 9. Other Director Items Announcements: Regarding the FY 2023 budget line-item fundraising, it was recommended to change that language to reflect investments, which would be better suited for the organization's needs. Additionally, it was clarified the BDB will be delivering the toolbox recommendations in the first quarter of FY 2022/2023. Lastly, it was determined that all board members be made aware, per Sunshine Law guidelines, all votes must be made in person and stress the importance of attending future meetings in person as their schedules permits.
- 11. Adjournment: There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:47 am.

## CONTRIBUTION OF AID TO BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT BOARD OF MARTIN COUNTY, INC. FROM THE CITY OF STUART

THIS CONTRIBUTION OF AID is made and entered into this 13<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2022, to the BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT BOARD OF MARTIN COUNTY, INC., (hereinafter referred to as "Board") a Florida not-for-profit organization, doing business at 1002 SE Monterey Commons Boulevard, Suite 207, Stuart, Florida 34996, by the CITY OF STUART, (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), a Florida municipal corporation, with offices at 121 SW Flagler Avenue, Stuart, Florida 34994.

- WHEREAS, the Business Development Board (BDB), is recognized by the State of Florida as the official Economic Development organization for Martin County; and
- WHEREAS, the City recognizes the Board as an organization which promotes economic development and prosperity in Martin County; and
- WHEREAS, the Board is responsible for providing assistance to new start-ups, existing businesses and other entities seeking to expand employment opportunities and make capital investments within the City of Stuart and Martin County; and
- WHEREAS, the Board is a 501(c)(6) not-for-profit, public-private partnership for economic development, funded by the Martin County Board of County Commissioners through a multi-year economic development services agreement, in addition to other non-profit and private sector investors who support its yearly operations; and
- WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to contribute to the overall county-wide economic development strategy, including programs and other initiatives that will promote the City as a premier business destination, yielding job growth and furthering capital investment in the City; and
- **WHEREAS**, it is the sense of the City Commission of the City of Stuart that an initial granting of aid in the amount of \$10,000 to the BDB to become a LEADERSHIP level member of the Board will serve the best interests of the community; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Stuart reserves up to \$15,000 as an additional allocation of funds to aid special projects that will specifically benefit the businesses and/or residents that reside within the city limits.
- **NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the promises and mutual agreements contained herein, the parties agree as follows:
- 1. Aid Contribution. The City hereby grants an initial contribution of \$10,000 to the Business Development Board of Martin County with up to an additional \$15,000 aid as an appropriation for special projects that will directly benefit city businesses and residents, for a total aid contribution not to exceed the amount of \$25,000, as provided herein.
- 2. **Term.** This agreement shall have a term of one (1) year commencing on the date signed by both parties and executed by the City Clerk.

## CONTRIBUTION OF AID TO BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT BOARD OF MARTIN COUNTY, INC. FROM THE CITY OF STUART

3. **Reporting.** The Board will provide the City Commission, City Manager or their designee written reports on economic development activities as follows:

Quarterly reports and a year-end report shall be furnished to the City of Stuart. In addition, at least two (2) in-person economic development briefings to the City Commission focused on economic development results, activities, programs, and initiatives from its annual business plan including highlights of key specific benefits with and in the City during the term of this agreement and any other presentations that may be requested from time to time.

- 4. City of Stuart Recognition and Participation. The Board will recognize the City of Stuart as a LEADERSHIP Level partner of its organization. (Model Exhibit A). The City will also continue have board member representation on the BDB's Board of Directors and the Partner's Council, and receive invitations to join and participate in all "Hubs of Excellence" activities such as roundtables, focus groups, one-on-one visits, and hosting teams.
- 5. Support Assistance for City Projects and Initiatives. The Board recognizes that the City of Stuart has its own robust community, economy, redevelopment and sustainability plans, and strategies which it is advancing to benefit its residents and businesses. As such, the Board is committed to building synergies with those plans and supporting and assisting the City in its efforts whereby business intelligence, market research, data gathering and analysis, outreach, promotion, and other general economic development services may be requested and agreed upon by both parties, as they so determine.
  - 6. **Fulfillment and Termination.** This agreement shall be in effect upon its execution and monies awarded for services rendered as outlined herein. The City reserves the right to terminate this agreement and withhold any amount or entirety of aid contributed for any or no reason given, provided that all approved and executed scopes of work have been reimbursed in accordance with the recitals provided herein.
  - 7. Effective Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue. This Aid agreement has been executed and delivered in Martin County, Florida, and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida, and jurisdiction and venue shall lie only in the state courts in and for Martin County, Florida.
  - 8. Amendment of Agreement. This Aid agreement shall not be amended, waived, or altered except by a written instrument properly executed by both parties.
  - 9. **Binding Aid Agreement; No Third Parties.** This contribution of aid in support and each of its agreements, covenants, contractual provisions, pledges, and deliverables shall be binding upon execution and shall inure only to the benefit of the public, and the parties hereto, and shall not be construed as benefitting any private third party, whatsoever.

1. Call to Order & Welcome: The meeting was called to order at 9:03 am by Jeff Leslie, President of the Board

**4. Approval of March 2, 2022, Executive Committee Minutes:** Tommy Bueno moved to accept minutes as presented. Seconded by Eric Kiehn. Approved 4-0.

- 5. Discussion: FY 2023 Proposed Business Plan and Budget Joan K. Goodrich presented the proposed FY 2023 Business Plan and Budget to the Executive Committee and highlighted the four (4) proposed priority area designed to build upon the BDB's efforts in FY 2022 and accomplish the following:
  - a. Informs Martin County is Open for Business (Now's the Time)
  - b. Fosters Leading Industries and Good Jobs (Hubs of Excellence)
  - c. Grows Our Own (Propel (Entrepreneurship), Pulse (Business Retention Expansion), Talent)
  - d. Promotes Strategic Areas and Districts for Job Creators

The Business Plan's proposed key metrics for performance accountability were also reviewed and discussed in depth with the result of adding number of businesses assisted to the top-level metrics of economic development announcements, jobs created-retained, square footage impacted, direct business capital investment generated, and referrals produced.

Ms. Goodrich also indicated the proposed FY 2023 Business Plan and Budget funds the next phase of the Now's the Time marketing campaign; key sales activities from the Hubs of Excellence Business Development Strategy focusing on the Aviation-Aerospace and Marine hubs; launch of the Corporate Council to lead the Pulse program featuring 50 visits-online surveys-year-end report; two Side Hustle to Main Gig cohorts; two Future of Work and Learning events; annual Martin County Business Awards and PR-Communications.

For staffing and leadership engagement in FY 2023, it was noted the budget funds the existing four full time positions, although as fundraising occurs and business development results and activities increase, staffing

plan upgrades may be needed. The current BDB Leadership Engagement Model launched in FY 2022 will continue and with a fundraising goal of \$185,000.

The Executive Committee stressed the importance of the addition, through the BDB's strategic advertising, storytelling and marketing efforts, the delivery of a more measured and defined approach on data points listing the specific ways the BDB has helped individual named local businesses, in what ways it has enhanced business development and promote and list itemized market attributes to drive the point that Martin County is open for business.

A motion was moved by Tommy Bueno to move the the FY 2023 Business Plan and Budget with proposed updates and the line-item budget as presented forward to the Board of Directors at their next meeting. Seconded by Eric Kiehn. Approved 4-0.

#### 6. 2 x 2 x 2.5 Board Initiative:

- **Testimonials**: PR Advisor lke Crumpler was asked to proactively draft messaging for missing testimonials as quickly as possible.
- Pulse Visits: 56 visits to date have been completed and the BDB is on track to meet the goal of 75 as additional visits are scheduled.
- Fundraising: While private sector investments continue to grow and with several new investors scheduled to be presented to the Board of Directors, it was agreed more effort is needed in this key area.
- 7. Staff Updates: Jaymie Sardo announced the successful launch of the virtual Side Hustle to Main Gig 6-week Entrepreneurial series which started on May 3, 2022, with 13 registered participants. President of the Board, Jeff Leslie of Leslie Ventures joined as the featured guest speaker sharing real life business experiences after the Business Plan presentation given by Tom Kindred, Regional Director for the FSBDC. The next virtual session will be Tuesday, May 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm.
- 8. Officer Comments and Updates: It was brought to the attention of the committee that a recent blog post associated with the Martin County Taxpayer's Association (MCTA) spoke negatively and incorrectly about the BDB's recent audit. Mitigation efforts include a request for to meet with the MCTA Board to update them on the BDB's efforts and to request a retraction.
- 9. Adjournment: There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:45 am.
