- CareerSource Research Coast, Employment Report for July 2024: Mary Murphy, Business Navigator, briefed the BDB Board on employment covering Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River Counties.
 - 1. Unemployment rate in the Research Coast region was 4.2%.
 - 2. State unemployment rate was 3.3%
 - 3. Martin County unemployment rate was 3.7%.
 - a. The Research Coast metro areas, year over year there was 7100 more jobs, with Education and Health Services gaining the most jobs with +2000 jobs and Professional and Business Services +1700 jobs.
 - b. Manufacturing lost 100 jobs.
- Project Sailfish Update It was announced that that Power Systems Manufacturing (PSM) is the manufacturer intending to expand their operations to the Treasure Coast, and has made an application to utilize the Martin County Incentive Toolkit for tax

abatement. Project will generate over \$1.2 million in new taxes adding 101 new advanced manufacturing jobs. Lonnie Houck from PSM gave a presentation to the Board. An initial resolution is scheduled for Board of County Commissioners consideration on September 10, 2024.

Subject: Attraction and Retention Leads Update

Please find attached an update of the active leads for Martin County and several projects that are being closed out.

The attraction projects include Power Systems Manufacturing, which received preliminary approval of an Ad Valorem Tax Exemption from the Martin County Board of County Commissioners on September 10th, 2024, with a 5-0 vote. This is only the second application to this program since its approval by the voters in 2010 and the first application to complete all the necessary steps and receive this approval. The applicant will now begin the purchase of equipment that is eligible for the Tangible Personal Property exemption and file the application for the next fiscal year with the Property Appraiser by March 1, 2024. Following that application, the applicant will return to the Board of County Commissioner for final approval of the exemption.

Other attraction projects include manufacturers of PVC pipes and fittings, MRO activities including repair of commercial and military engines, testing of eVTOLs, ammunition manufacturing, and other manufacturers. These projects are primarily seeking facilities or land that can accommodate their needs and operations, as well as assistance that includes addressing power needs and assistance to establish a Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ).

The BDB is working on one retention project for a company whose lease expires in 2026 and is searching for a new campus. Other challenges include aging equipment and ownership changes.

The projects that are being closed out include the Florida First Sites application for a 100+ acre site in Indiantown, which is no longer available for the program due to being encumbered by another use. Three additional sites are being closed out because no site match accommodated the prospect's needs.

One note: most of the project leads are considering other sites along the Treasure Coast and, in some cases, sites in Texas, in the Houston area.

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Power Systems Manufacturing

PSM is expanding with a new power generation manufacturing and service business line. It is seeking 180,000 to 200,000 space to create approximately 101 jobs on the Treasure Coast.



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







TOP 10 LARGEST INDUSTRIES BY 2023





WORKER (2023)




TOP 10 LARGEST OCCUPATIONS BY 2023 JOBS
